Subject: Economic Prosperity for Florida, United States, and World, Citizens – Job Generation through Intellectual Property Conception Incentives and the Retention of those Properties for the use by Florida Companies and as incentive to draw Businesses to Florida and create New Businesses in Florida

Thank you for your letter of response. It gives me an incentive to continue to respond; however, I see nothing in it that will bring about the changes necessary to genuinely create jobs in Florida. What we are trying to tell you is that there needs to be a major change in the expenditure thinking from what is presently available in order to get Florida's and the United States economy started again. I see that some of your designated investment subjects may not be beneficial to the environment and energy conservation and others may have come close to reaching the limits of their advancement ability. (We are a cutting edge company in each field of invention).

I see that that you have requested a 100 million for an incentive fund; however, I see that you don't have any mention of an incentive to drive the production of intellectual materials that would produce jobs and create experiments that would produce progress. Therefore, in essence you don't have any plans that will produce a tangible result for the state. Without teaming inventors with R&D facilities nothing productive can occur. Our company is currently being strangled by lack of funding that is greatly restricting the production of intellectual materials necessary to accomplish the objective goals of advancing human interests through innovation. My previous letter contained information about establishing a board of investment experts to view the most financially advantageous expenditures of funds. This board should be made of professional risk analysis persons to ensure the proper selection of the top rated invention development projects. Without the funding of inventors, the incentive to create, no progress will occur.

Contrary to the belief of many individuals, higher education does not produce innovation. It does however make excellent pre-requisites for research and development personnel if it is a properly designed education program for this purpose. The attitude of universities accepting only donated

projects needs to change since under this program, only the stupid or ultra wealthy would agree to donate. I see that your \$100,000,000 funding contains nothing for individual inventors. Keep in mind that any of these jobs that you bring to the state at high cost will be subject to layoffs in the event that inventors advance their product lines to the point where their product is obsolete. The production of new intellectual property produces unsatisfied consumer demand that drives the production of products to the top of their category and reduces the demand for the obsolete products that are produced out of state; thereby increasing jobs in Florida. Florida and myself are presently losing billions, if not trillions, of dollars due to our inability to afford the filing of patents in foreign venues that could be utilized for the state's investment and produce revenues for the state and generate jobs through world headquartering. We would request your immediate attention to this problem in hopes of correcting these unfortunate situations as soon as possible.

Any plan involving public expenditure should be studied by us in order to point out cost saving directions that can make the difference between investment in the obsolete and investment in the most optimal expenditures possible. This service of ours cost nothing. It just requires definite plans from yourselves or any business entity and contract signing for 15% of the savings The state, businesses, or public, receive 85%. This applies to all categories of advancement from A-Z. From my experience, the world goes nowhere significantly in invention or innovation without my intellectual property conceptions. I've mapped out thousands of major ones thus far.

I see a problem with the new legislation that many states have passed, including Florida, concerning disallowance of any tax increases on gasoline with respect to energy conservation to reduce pollution. Clearly this will be a dis-incentive to inventors to conceive inventions that will improve fuel economy. This will retard the innovation and cost the citizens 85% of the savings they could have had, assuming they paid the inventors 15% as an incentive for the invention. Clearly these bills should be amended to include a provision dealing with this issue.

We are hopeful that this year will be different than the last years and that innovation and invention can finally begin for the state economy's recovery.

Please tell us how to get in touch with the Florida State Legislature Bill Drafting Department so we can bring these important changes to their attention in the event that the Governor or this office is unwilling to pursue the matter.
